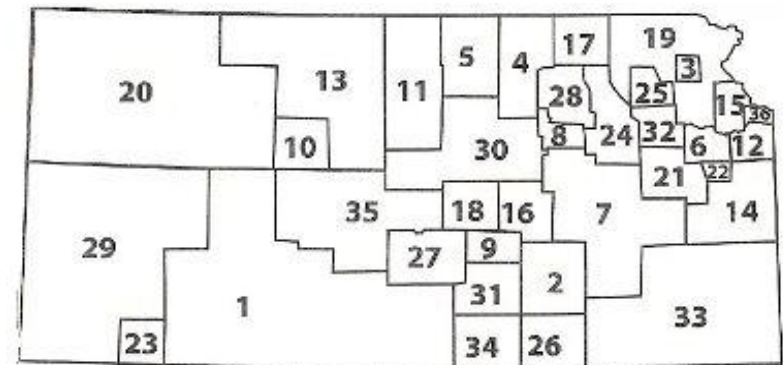

infants and toddlers with
special needs in Kansas

In 2007-2008, *tiny-k* services provided **34,621** screenings and served **6,643** children and their families.

Upon completion of *tiny-k* services, at least 30% children either exited the program with identified outcomes achieved, or did not qualify for further special education services.

How can I make a referral to *tiny-k*? Contact a *tiny-k* Network in your community using the map inside.

Who is eligible for *tiny-k* services? Infants and toddlers, under 36 months, with disabilities and developmental delays.

What does early intervention provide and what will it do for the child/family? Services include speech, occupational and physical therapies, audiology, special instruction, family training, assistive technology, social work, vision, psychological, and nutrition services. There are also specific types of medical, health, nursing and transportation services available. A family service coordinator is available to assist families with the evaluation and eligibility determination, IFSP development and service provision, including assistance to ease the transition to Part B Special Education Services when the child reaches age 3.

How much does it cost the family? These services are provided at no charge to the family through the programs as described in Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).
